Assassin's Creed was one of the most highly anticipated games of 2007, released on November 13th, but did it live up to all expectations? The simple answer to that question is no, but it is hard to criticize a game that does so many difficult things right. The presentation of the game is phenomenal, the graphics are beautiful, and the controls are set up well. The concept and setting of the game are great. You play as Altair, a member of the Hashshashin (or Assassins), a real-life group that performed politically-motivated murders between the 11th and 13th centuries. Set in the Middle East during the third crusade, Assassin's Creed is fused with some historical fact.

So what went wrong? To begin with, there is a big twist in the game. That would be acceptable and almost expected, but the problem is that the "big twist" in the game happens about 5 or 10 minutes into the game. A comparison that has been thrown out there to show how that could affect the story is this: imagine you are watching the Sixth Sense and find out 10 minutes into the movie that Bruce Willis is dead. That could take away from the story a bit wouldn't you say? Next, certain things you have to do can become repetitious and surprisingly easy. Despite these things though, taking out your target and the pursuit that follows is fun and entertaining. Assassin's Creed even leaves the door wide open for an awesome sequel. I rate this game an 8/10.
